CAPITAL REGION FOOD PROGRAM PROVIDES LOCAL AGENCIES WITH FOOD FOR THANKSGIVING HOLIDAY

CONCORD, NH — The Capital Region Food Program (CRFP) purchased 325 cases of food, in addition to 171 turkeys and 104 chickens, for the month of November for its Year Round Distribution Project (YRDP). On November 15th, the cases, the equivalent of over 2.5 tons of food, were distributed to 18 local agencies that serve Concord and the surrounding communities. The distribution was held at the Market Basket on Storrs Street in Concord.

The recipient agencies were: Boscawen Congregational Church, Town of Boscawen Human Services, Town of Bow, City of Concord Human Services, Suncook CAP, Hopkinton Food Pantry, Immaculate Conception Church Food Pantry, Allenstown & Pembroke Interfaith Food Pantry, Pembroke Welfare, Webster Food Pantry, Pittsfield Food Pantry, Merrimack Valley Day Care, Friendly Kitchen, First Congregational Church, Centerpoint Food Pantry, St. Peter's Church – St. Vincent de Paul Society, St. Paul's Church Food Pantry, and Unitarian Universalist Church.

The YRDP donates cases of food to local agencies ten times throughout the year. This year, the YRDP distributed over 26 tons of food to its participating organizations, which then provided those donations to families of need in the Greater Concord Area.

The Capital Region Food Program, in association with social service agencies, area food pantries, and church groups, has been dedicated to the elimination of hunger in Greater Concord Area since 1974 through distribution of food to individuals and families.
