CAPITAL REGION FOOD PROGRAM ANNOUNCES 1ST ANNUAL GOLF TOURNAMENT SEPTEMBER 29

CONCORD, NH — The Capital Region Food Program invites golfers to their 1st Annual Golf Tournament on Monday, September 29, 2008 at the Concord Country Club. By participating, golfers will help the CRFP celebrate its 35th year of working to reduce hunger in 18 communities in the Greater Concord area.

All proceeds from the golf tournament will go directly to purchasing food items used in the CRFP's two programs. The Year Round Distribution Project (YRDP), formalized in 1992, provides monthly supplemental food supplies to 27 area food pantries. The Holiday Food Basket Project, established in 1974, provides over 1800 families with a holiday meal and food for an additional two to three weeks.

The tournament is a scramble format with a shotgun start at 9 a.m. The registration fee of \$150 per person includes the greens fee for 18 holes of golf, a cart and dinner. The entry fee for a foursome is \$550. Prizes for lowest score, closest to the pin and longest drive will be awarded. In addition, individuals or organizations wishing to sponsor a hole, a tee, golf carts, beverage cart or any portion of the dinner will receive recognition throughout the tournament.
