CAPITAL REGION FOOD PROGRAM UNVEILS NEW WEBSITE

CONCORD, NH— The Capital Region Food Program (CRFP) re-launched its informational website on Monday, March 10, 2008. The website, www.capitalregionfoodprogram.org, now features a list of local service agencies the CRFP partners with, information on how to donate to and how to volunteer with the CRFP, and information on special events.

Now in their 35th year of working to reduce hunger in 18 communities in the Greater Concord area, the CRFP's two initiatives are highlighted on the new website. The Year Round Distribution Project (YRDP), formalized in 1992, provides monthly supplemental food supplies to 27 area food pantries. The Holiday Food Basket Project, established in 1974, provides over 1800 families with a holiday meal and food for an additional two to three weeks.

According to Cheryl A. Elliott, Chair of the Capital Region Food Program, "Our revised website, developed by our volunteers, helps define the CRFP's mission and provide information on the important services we provide each year."
