CAPITAL REGION FOOD PROGRAM DISTRIBUTES NONPERISHABLE FOOD TO 18 LOCAL ORGANIZATIONS

CONCORD, NH — The Capital Region Food Program (CRFP) distributed nearly four (4) tons of nonperishable food items to eighteen social service agencies, food pantries and churches as part of the program's Year-Round Distribution Project (YRDP) on Tuesday, May 12.

This special YRDP distribution replaced the National Association of Letter Carriers' 28th annual Stamp Out Hunger® Food Drive, which has been postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Organizations receiving food as part of this month's distribution included: Blueberry Express Day Care, Boscawen Congregational Church Food Pantry, Centerpoint Food Pantry, Christ the King Food Pantry, Concord Area Community Action Program (CAP), Concord Human Services, Epsom Food Pantry, First Congregational Church Food Pantry, Friends of Forgotten Children, Gospel Light Food Pantry, Loudon Food Pantry, Merrimack Valley Daycare, Open Door Community Kitchen, Pittsfield Food Pantry, Salvation Army, Suncook Community Action Program (CAP), Warner Community Action Program (CAP), and West Congregational Church Food Pantry.

As part of the Year-Round Distribution Project, non-perishable items such as canned fruit and vegetables, peanut butter, breakfast cereal, pasta, and soups are distributed at no cost to participating agencies.
